

Testimonials for Stan Pannaman

You are likely already aware, but if not, it's with a heavy heart that I share the passing of Stanley Pannaman on July 2. He was a cherished member of our Sierra Everglades advocacy leadership. To many of us, this loss feels personal. I thought I would share a little bit of my interactions w/ him as a tribute to him & his passion for service.

My son and I met Stan over 8 years ago, in 2014, as volunteers attending an Everglades conference. My early interactions w/ Stan were about the neglected pollution that harms the Everglades & our planet at night (light pollution). I became an "official" member of Sierra Club on April 13, 2014, a few hours after a warm invitation from them in response to an email that led to an article by PopularResistance.org on light pollution. Stanley was among the first Sierrans I met that cared to join the fight against this neglected but growing pollution.

On a very personal note, *Stanley was one of the few I interacted with hours before my dad passed away* in my bedroom (Oct 1, 2014), sharing via email w/ him that I was "dealing with my dad's deteriorating health condition... with only hours or days left". He gave me one of his bear hugs the day after my dad joined the stars.

I became SC staff in 2016, and Stanley was one of those faithful volunteer leaders I could always count on: at press conferences for climate action and to oppose toll roads, at a talk for a film about the Miami River & its headwaters, at an Everglades conference where he was so happy to honor Betty Osceola (some pictures here). In 2019, he got a Sierra Club Manatee Award for nearly two decades as a dedicated Broward Sierra volunteer, 15 of those in their ExCom. Stanley's inspiration for service included a genuine concern for the future of children. In 2018, in an interview with The Center for Public Integrity, he shared his concerns about fossil fuel pollution and climate change: "All of these things: discourages me to know. And, not for me, my life is coming to an end soon. But my grandchildren and my great grandchildren, this is just beginning, what kind of planet are we leaving them?"



There are many stories about Stanley, but my favorite is the one that made him famous to the world: as a veteran that took a bullet (literally) to save baby sea turtles. In 2015, Stan "went the extra mile to protect sea turtles - and got shot for it." While out monitoring turtle nests, a drunk guy grabbed Stan's concealed gun, beat him in the head, threw him on the sand, and fired a shot that thankfully only landed in his butt (kid you not, I saw his wound!) In an interview by Sun-Sentinel, Stan said: "Never in my wildest dreams did I think monitoring sea turtle nests was going to be a life-threatening experience. Never, never once came into my mind." The interviewer went on to ask him "Are you going to keep doing it?" And Stanley responded: "Of course!" and went on to share: "I get great pleasure at watching a hatch-out and watching these turtles do what they've done for a million and a half years, and you can't hide in your house and put blinders on, and I REFUSE to do that".

<u>PETA gave him an award</u> for his act of heroism: "Thanks to Mr. Pannaman, these nesting sea turtles have a chance to live free in the ocean... and hopes that his good deeds inspire others to come to the aid of animals in need."

Please, join me in honoring his beautiful life of service: as a veteran, as an environmentalist, as a father, grandfather, great-grandpa, and friend. I'm going to miss him very much, but I'm glad he gave me one last big kiss and bear hug a few months ago while celebrating Earth Day.

NATIONAL SIERRA CLUB AWARDS COMMISSIONER BEAM FURR THE ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE AWARD



The Broward County Sierra Group nominated Commissioner Furr for a National Sierra Club award, and the National Sierra Club wholeheartedly agreed. Commissioner Furr has been awarded **The Environmental Service Award**.

Commissioner Furr stands out from the crowd because he is a long-term planner and thinker. He doesn't go for the flashy short term attention getting projects. He is working for our future and the well-being of our children and that includes a healthy environment, public transportation, policies that promote the reduction of carbon emissions, and clean energy options. These are what build a robust and fulfilling place to live.

He has always made himself available to listen to our concerns on environmental issues and has consistently championed those issues to the County Commissioners. He never stops.

But for those who don't know him. Beam Furr is the Broward County Commissioner representing District Six, which comprises parts of Hollywood, Hallandale Beach, West Park, Pembroke Park, Dania Beach, and Fort Lauderdale. He was first elected to the Broward County Commission in 2014. Prior to that, he was a Hollywood city commissioner for 12 years. As an elected official, he has always focused on environmental issues, early childhood education, transportation, housing, economic opportunity, and the arts. Commissioner Furr was a teacher in the Broward County School system for 25 years.

Broward Sierra August General Meeting

Our next meeting will be August 4, 2022, at 700 PM via Zoom. Our speaker will be **Rachel Skubel**. Her topic: **An overview of Florida's Coral Reef**.



Rachel is a researcher, educator, conservation practitioner, and communications professional. She holds a Ph.D. from the University of Miami, where she studied climate vulnerability in shark fisheries and policymaking for marine conservation. Originally from Canada, she completed her M.Sc. at McMaster University, studying the carbon and water dynamics of forests in response to extreme weather. In her current role as the Awareness and Appreciation Coordinator for FDEP's Coral Reef Conservation Program, Rachel oversees education, stakeholder engagement, and outreach within the South Florida community.

In this presentation, we'll chat about what corals are, why they're so important to South Florida, what threats they face here, and what we can do to protect them. Florida's Coral Reef extends over 350 nautical miles from the Dry Tortugas to the St. Lucie Inlet in Martin County. The five counties bordering the reefs are home to over 6 million people. South Florida's economy and way of life are inextricably linked to the coral reef ecosystem. The reefs provide habitat for species that are valuable to commercial and recreational fisheries, serve as a new frontier for biomedical research, attract tourists who bolster our economy, and protect our coastlines from storms and flooding.
