
- The Primary Election will be on August 23 (deadline to register is Mon, July 25)

If you're already registered, verify your registration by clicking on **My Voter Info** to make sure all your information is correct. This is also where you'll see if you're signed up for Vote-by-Mail (VBM). VBM is a great way to vote. You can drop off VBM ballots at polling locations and you don't need to stand in line! If you're not signed up for VBM, click on **Vote By Mail** to request a VBM Ballot.

Jessica Floyd joins American Bridge as President, having most recently served as Managing Director of Campaigns at the Hub Project, where she oversaw numerous projects and campaigns related to the economy and democracy, including multi-year accountability efforts against Republicans in the House and Senate. Floyd has spent her career designing and managing issue advocacy and electoral campaigns at local, state, and national levels. Following several successful campaigns in New York and New Jersey, Floyd managed Congressman Ron Barber's winning congressional campaign and served as Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords' political director. During the 2014 and 2016 cycles. she worked for Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee's Independent Expenditure. In 2016, she was the Deputy Director, where she helped to manage paid media programs in targeted districts around the country.

She also has extensive experience in government. She managed government affairs in New York for the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, served as district director for Rep. Ron Barber, and worked in the executive office for the New York governor. Floyd has a Masters in comparative government from the London School of Economics and was named one of the American Association of Political Consultants' 40 under 40.

Blowing Rocks Preserve Outing

On May 28th, Broward Sierra Club Outing leaders Adriene Barmann and Alfredo Aguirre hosted a spectacular outing at Blowing Rocks Nature Preserve on Jupiter Island. Blowing Rocks Preserve, located in Hobe Sound, is one of The Nature Conservancy's four premiere Florida preserves. Although it is the smallest at 73 acres, it has been recorded as being the most popular in terms of visitation, which can be largely credited to the gorgeous beachfront access that includes the titular Blowing Rocks, the largest rocky Anastasia limestone shoreline along the Atlantic coast. At high tide, when the water is rough, the waves break against the rocks and force plumes of saltwater up to an impressive 50 feet skyward. The natural features found here provide a home for many endangered species, and include vital nesting grounds for the rare loggerhead, leatherback, and green sea turtle. In addition, Blowing Rocks Preserve features several short, scenic walking trails, including Maggy's Path, which showcases the Indian River Lagoon coastline with replanted native mangroves from the preserve's own plant nursery, as well as a neighboring native scrubland ecosystem.

We were fortunate to experience an amazing tour with Joshua Whitman, S. Florida Operations Coordinator and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Team Coordinator for the Nature Conservancy preserve. We explored the habitat along the coastline of the Indian River Lagoon, noting the mangroves and the coastal scrub that align with the lagoon. We saw mounds of moonflower and wild balsam apple vines surrounding the sea grapes and saw palmetto along the coastline. We learned that even this small parcel of land contributes to the health of the ecosystem including the lagoon's estuary that supports local fish and wildlife.

Josh directed us across the street through the tangled bower of sea grapes shading the sandy trail to the beach. And as we emerged up the stairs towards the sea, beautiful eroded rocks of the Anastasia limestone formations, that are on the edge of the beach meeting the Atlantic Ocean, stood out with amazing carved-out formations of jagged limestone rock. It was hard to believe we were still in Florida, but we were there exploring the tide pools and spectacular views on the small Florida-style cliffs.

We spent the rest of the morning soaking in the ocean and lounging on the beach. Then we took an awesome bike ride heading north along the coastline surrounded by spacious mansions. We found ourselves at the Indian River Lagoon with a picturesque view of the waterway and surrounding tree islands. After a water break, it was time to head back to our cars and to call it a wonderful day!!

Adriene Barmann, Broward Group Otter Award

The Otter Award honors a Group member who has done an outstanding job for the Group's outings program. Since 2010, Barmann has inspired members and non-members to experience the outdoors both in person and virtually during the pandemic.

Sue Caruso, Broward Group Manatee Award

The Manatee Award honors a Group member who has done an outstanding job of service to the Group. Sue is a longtime volunteer and inspiration. She works doggedly to protect the environment from unnecessary development, educating both the public and public officials as a spokesperson and activist.

Cat Uden, Broward Group Cypress Award

The Cypress Award is for an individual who has contributed greatly to the public's environmental awareness. Uden is a powerhouse fighting plastic pollution and single-use plastics, working with local government officials to pass ordinances banning plastic pollution.

Commissioner Melissa P. Dunn, Broward Group Osprey Award

This award is presented for extraordinary effort by a governmental staff person to promote or effect changes in policy or practice to protect or preserve Florida's environment. Vice Mayor Melissa P. Dunn was elected to the City of Lauderhill Commission in November 2020. Since joining Broward Sierra Club she has shown she is a strong voice for environmental issues including sponsoring an ordinance to repeal M-CORES and an ordinance to ban single-use plastics and polystyrene on City owned property.

NATIONAL SIERRA CLUB AWARDS COMMISSIONER BEAM FURR



EDGAR WAYBURN ENVIRONMENTAL CHAMPION AWARD

The Sierra Club's top award for persons in public service who have championed environmental causes. The award honors the late Dr. Edgar Wayburn, a five-term president of the Sierra Club, champion of public lands and recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1999 from President Bill Clinton.

The Broward County Sierra Group nominated Commissioner Furr for this prestigious award, and the National Sierra Club wholeheartedly agreed.

Commissioner Furr stands out from the crowd because he is a long-term planner and thinker. He doesn't go for the flashy short term attention getting projects. He is working for our future, a healthy environment, public transportation, developing policies that promote the reduction of carbon emissions, increasing clean energy options and the wellbeing of our children. These are what build a robust and fulfilling place to live.

He has always made himself available to listen to our concerns on environmental issues and has consistently championed those issues to the County Commissioners. He never stops.

But for those who don't know him. Beam Furr is the Broward County Commissioner representing District Six, which comprises parts of Hollywood, Hallandale Beach, West Park, Pembroke Park, Dania Beach, and Fort Lauderdale. He was first elected to the Broward County Commission in 2014. Prior to that, he was a Hollywood city commissioner for 12 years. As an elected official, he has always focused on environmental issues, early childhood education, transportation, housing, economic opportunity, and the arts. Commissioner Furr was a teacher in the Broward County School system for 25 years.

Loxahatchee Group July General Meeting

The next general meeting for the Loxahatchee Group will be July 28, 2022 at 700 PM via Zoom. Their speaker will be Michael McGrath and the topic will be **Clean Water Conversation: 101 - Florida's Water Quality Crisis, Harmful Algae Blooms, and Slime Crimes**.



Michael McGrath is an Organizing Representative for Sierra Club Florida's Red Tide and Wildlands campaigns. Based in Fort Myers, he focuses on water quality standards that stop pollution at its source, promoting urban fertilizer ordinances, springs protection, Everglades restoration, endangered species protection, landscape conservation programs, phosphate mining, and protecting wild and rural lands from development pressures. Michael also represents Sierra Club on the Florida Springs Council's Board of Directors and within the Everglades Coalition. McGrath's organizing experiences are underpinned by his experiences in both urban and rural settings.

In recent years, Florida has faced an onslaught of water quality woes across the state:

- Prolonged blue-green algae and red tide blooms bring the stench of dead fish washing up on our shores.
- Record-setting manatee mortality events are caused by staggering losses of seagrasses across the state and in places like the Indian River Lagoon.
- Toxic blue-green algae, red tide, and murky springs threaten public health, our economy, property values, and ultimately our quality of life.

Our state is in the midst of an unprecedented water quality crisis and our ecosystems are on the verge of an irreversible tipping point. To better understand Florida's water quality crisis, we will dive into details of what lies beneath the surface of these "slime crimes" looking closely at the state's failure to regulate and hold polluters accountable, what specifically needs to be done to stop pollution at its source, and how you can be engaged in the movement for clean water.
