

14th Annual Southeast Florida Climate Leadership Summit

I attended the 14th Annual Southeast Florida Climate Leadership Summit in Fort Lauderdale last week, and it was an honor and a wonderful opportunity to hear speakers and panelists who are on the forefront of addressing the climate change crisis. I was truly inspired as I was able to connect with fellow activists, elected officials and representatives of innovative industries that have developed sustainable services that improve the environment and address climate change. I saw some of our environmental locals that include Stephanie Pearson from the League of Women Voters, Cat Uden from Oceana, Scott Lewis from Broward Climate Alliance, Laura Tellez from Solar United Neighbors, as well as my fellow Sierra Club super heroes Emily Robinson, Tiffany Grantham (alias the Manatee), Leah Weisburd, Susan Steinhauser, and Rhonda Roff.

I was in environmental heaven as I listened to world renown speakers as they presented both their research, and their work to decrease carbon output, reducing plastic waste and sustainability in their regions as climate change encompasses our planet. I was so proud of Jennifer Jeraldo, Broward County's chief Resilience officer and Jason Liechty, who were the leaders of the team that organized the event. Jennifer spoke at the session: Connectors in Chief: Resilience Officers Look ahead. They discussed resilience highlights, key initiatives and pending challenges and the tools and resources that they use now and will use in the future to address the impacts of climate change.

Everywhere I walked another network connection was made. At the Broward Sierra Club table, we had multiple visitors who wanted to know about our impactful work and outreach projects. They played our spinning game, and if the color they chose landed on the pin, they were able to choose a sustainable prize. We had lots of pamphlets to hand out, as well as information pamphlets from other organizations that are aligned with Sierra Club. We shared information about our upcoming signature event Earth Day 23 "Saving our Environment", and the plastic art contest for high school kids.

I could share so much more about the summit, but there is not enough room to write about it. The big takeaway is that the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact is a partnership between Broward, Miami-Dade, Monroe, and Palm Beach Counties, to work collaboratively to reduce regional greenhouse gas emissions, implement adaptation strategies, and build climate resilience across the Southeast Florida region. It's an annual event, and each county has an opportunity to shine, and Broward County had their turn, and the entire event was outstanding. This year's theme was Connect, Commit, Act, and surely the visitors were motivated to address climate change, and to understand the implications that all of us must adapt to our changing world. Look out for next year's event in Dade County.
