The Inflation Reduction Act is a 10-year plan covering new and reinstated tax laws that provides credits and deductions for individuals, businesses, tax exempt and government entities.

Use Form 5695 to figure and take your residential energy credits.

The residential energy credits are:

- The nonbusiness energy property credit, and
- The residential energy efficient property credit.

Home Energy Tax Credits | Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov)

If you make energy improvements to your home, tax credits are available for a portion of qualifying expenses. The credit amounts and types of qualifying expenses were expanded by the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022.



Energy Efficient Home Improvement Credit | Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov)

If you make qualified energy-efficient improvements to your home after Jan. 1, 2023, you may qualify for a tax credit up to \$3,200. You can claim the credit for improvements made through 2032.



Residential Clean Energy Credit | Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov)

If you invest in renewable energy for your home such as solar, wind, geothermal, fuel cells or battery storage technology, you may qualify for an annual residential clean energy tax credit.

Public Law 117-169, 136 Stat. 1818 (August 16, 2022), commonly known as the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 (IRA), amended the credits for energy efficient home improvements under § 25C of the Internal Revenue Code (Code) and residential energy property under § 25D of the Code.
