

Topic:

The Right to Clean Water Petition, and Why to Sign It!

The right to clean water is a proposed constitutional amendment in Florida that would create a "fundamental right to clean and healthy waters". The amendment would allow lawsuits against state agencies for harm or threatened harm to lakes, rivers, wetlands and other types of water bodies. The Everglades, Florida Springs, the Indian River Lagoon, the St. Johns River, the Caloosahatchee River, the Suwanee River, the Santa Fe River, Apalachicola Bay, Biscayne Bay, Tampa Bay, Pensacola Bay and all other Florida waters have a right to clean water. The right to clean water is meant to acknowledge that bodies of water in the state of Florida have four fundamental rights: the right to exist, the right to flow, the right to be free of pollution, and the right to maintain a healthy ecosystem.

# World Oceans Month

This month, we celebrate the extraordinary beauty and diversity that our oceans hold, from the vibrant coral reefs teeming with life to the mysterious depths inhabited by unique and often unknown species. Thriving oceans are essential to our economy, our health, and our livelihoods. Just as Rotary supports clean water around the globe, billions of people around the globe depend on healthy oceans.

## Ban the Intentional Littering of Balloons

Balloons are the only type of refuse that individuals are expressly permitted to litter legally in Florida. HB 321 passed almost unanimously, so it was a bipartisan effort.

The Florida Legislature passed this bill that would prohibit the intentional release of balloons. It is imperative that Governor DeSantis either signs this bill into law or allows it to become law without taking action. Link to bill info: <u>https://www.flsenate.gov/Session/Bill/2024/321</u>

#### Key talking points:

- Hello, I'm calling to voice my strong support for H.B. 321, Release of Balloons, a bill that overwhelmingly passed in the Florida Legislature.
- I'm respectfully asking Governor DeSantis to protect our environment and businesses by signing this bill into law.

#### More talking points on balloon releases:

- Balloons and their ribbons present a threat of entanglement and ingestion to birds and marine wildlife like dolphins and endangered sea turtles as well as farm animals.
  - Studies have found that balloons ranked #3 in the deadliest ocean trash for key wildlife and are the deadliest form of plastic debris for seabirds.
  - Sea turtles & other marine life are known to confuse balloons for jellyfish.
  - When an animal swallows a balloon, it can block its intestinal tract, leading to starvation and death.
- Balloons can travel long distances some balloons have traveled thousands of miles across state lines which means that even protected areas and isolated waterways are at risk.
  - Balloons have been found in remote areas in the Florida Everglades.
  - Recently, over 1,500 balloons were recovered in a cleanup in Biscayne National Park.
- Balloons can endanger humans as well as wildlife they can become entangled in power lines, and metallic foil balloons have caused fires and power outages.
- Balloons released into the environment act just like other plastic waste they can persist for years, fouling habitats, clogging storm drains, and endangering wildlife.
  - Florida should not allow exemptions for latex balloons marketed as "biodegradable," as they do not degrade easily in the marine environment and often have dangerous attachments like strings and plastic clips.




