


Musings From The Chair...

Dallas Sierrans Complete The Great Saunter

The Dallas Sierra Club is thrilled to congratulate four of our outstanding outings leaders for completing The 37th Annual Great Saunter. The Great Saunter is an organized one-day 32-mile walk around the outside edge of Manhattan Island, in New York City.

Jim Robarge, our current Outings Chair; Mark Stein, our immediate past Outings Chair; Clay Morton, Dallas outings leader; and Arthur Kuehne, past Outings Chair and current Treasurer completed the walk on May 4th.

The group trained for the Saunter with a number of long hikes in the Dallas area before heading off to New York. They report that the training paid off, and they completed the 32 miles with relative ease.

The Great Saunter is organized by a non-profit group called Shorewalkers. In addition to The Great Saunter, Shorewalkers hosts many other walks around New York City and is dedicated to promoting and preserving New York City's waterfront. The Great Saunter has been held annually since 1987.

The Great Saunter started at the southern tip of Manhattan and went north along the Hudson River to the northern tip of the island. It then turned south and followed the eastern edge of the island along the Harlem and East Rivers until it got back to the starting point. This year, 2,985 signed up and 1,695 saunterers finished the route.
