

Speak Up Against Large Gas Plant Siting!



Pinal County Energy Center, LLC, a subsidiary of Seguro Energy Partners LLC, is seeking a certificate of environmental compatibility (CEC) with the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee to construct up to 480 megawatts (MW) of methane gas generation two miles south of Casa Grande. This project, known as Project Bella, is the largest stand-alone gas plant being proposed in Arizona.

There are much cleaner, less environmentally harmful, and affordable alternatives to this gasfired project, including solar energy, wind, and energy efficiency. Building a large gas plant that uses groundwater and that pollutes our air and harms our climate is not sustainable! This will cause significant harm to the total environment of the area and is not in the public interest.
