General Services Administration	\$2.15 billion	Until September 30, 2026	(SEC. 60503) Federal Buildings Fund to acquire and install low-embodied carbon materials and products for use in the construction or alteration of buildings under the jurisdiction, custody, and control of the GSA. “Low-embodied carbon materials and products” means materials and products identified by the Admin of the EPA as having substantially lower levels of embodied carbon as compared to estimated industry averages of similar products or materials.”
Department of Transportation	\$2 billion	Until September 30, 2026	(SEC. 60506) FHWA to reimburse the incremental cost of using low-embodied carbon construction materials. “FHWA Admin shall review the low-embodied carbon construction materials and products identified by the Admin of the EPA and shall identify low-embodied carbon construction materials and products...”
Environmental Protection Agency	\$250 million	Until September 30, 2031	(SEC. 60112) EPD grants and tech asst to businesses and states/tribes/nonprofits that support such businesses, and “other activities that assist in measuring, reporting, and steadily reducing the quantity of embodied carbon of construction materials and products”
	\$100 million	Until September 30, 2026	(SEC. 60116) Low-embodied carbon labeling program for construction materials for transportation projects, in consultation with FHWA.
Housing and Urban Development	\$837.5 million	Until September 30, 2028	(SEC. 30002) HUD to fund projects “including to subsidize gross obligations for the principal amount of direct loans, not to exceed \$4B that ... implement low-emission technologies, materials, or processes... or address climate resilience of multifamily properties.”
Federal Emergency Management Agency	Undefined	Until September 30, 2026	(SEC. 70006) Authority to provide financial assistance thru Sept 30, 2026 for costs associated with low-carbon materials, and incentives that encourage low-carbon and net-zero energy projects (w/ increased Fed cost share)
