Weekiwachee Preserve Hearing Aug. 27th



The <u>Southwest Florida Water Management District</u> (District) will review a draft management plan update for the Weekiwachee Preserve on Tuesday, August 27th at their offices at 2379 Broad Street in Brooksville, FL. Please plan to attend and share your comments and concerns.

The 11,206-acre Weekiwachee Preserve is part of a regional system of conservation lands that preserve numerous habitats, including coastal hardwood hammocks, hardwood swamps, freshwater and saltwater marshes, and sandhills. It also provides a protective buffer to several miles of the Weeki Wachee River.

The draft plan is available at <u>WaterMatters.org/LMPUpdates</u>. Every ten years, the District reviews and updates land management plans to ensure its public conservation lands are acquired to preserve and protect water resources and natural systems while also providing public access for recreation.

A virtual public meeting was held July 24th to discuss plan updates. Virtual comments were accepted through July 29th to inform the public, solicit input from stakeholders, and incorporate that feedback into the new 10-year plan. At the August 27th meeting, the final plan will be presented to the Governing Board for discussion prior to its final adoption on September 24 at the Tampa Governing Board Meeting.

Sierra Club Adventure Coast Group leaders attended the virtual hearing and have submitted written comments. Our main recommendations are:

- 1. The Plan should include a Black Bear Management Plan that with design and management guidance to avoid human-bear interactions in public use areas. The Chassahowitzka Black Bear subpopulation is one of the most imperiled in the state with less than 20 bears.
- 2. We support plans to implement the Leave No Trace Program. The Preserve provides public access to a growing population of hikers, bikers, and bird watchers. We also encourage placement of bear-deterrent recycling bins for public use and a preserve-wide system of recycling to manage the disposal of recyclables as well as signage to encourage visitors to recycle.
- 3. To support the passive recreational use strategy for the Preserve, the Plan should be strengthened to rule out the creation of an artificial beach and swim area in any future recreational plans.
- 4. We support full funding to acquire additional lands adjacent to the Preserve to ensure protection from encroachment and expand the functionality of the Preserve's critical linkage to the Florida Wildlife Corridor. The Weekiwachee Preserve is located adjacent to an area of rapid urban development and increasing population.

5. The plan should be modified to include the Springs Protection Zone (SPZ) for the Weeki Wachee River. Among other functions, the SPZ is designed to protect and restore the river's shoreline which forms much of the Preserve's northern border.
