- 2. **Register**: Once you find an event, register online. This helps organizers plan for the number of volunteers and ensures you get all the necessary information.
- 3. **Prepare**: Wear comfortable clothing, bring gloves, sunscreen, a hat, and plenty of water. Some events may provide supplies, but it's always good to be prepared.
- 4. **Participate**: Show up on the day of the event, ready to help clean up the coast! Follow the instructions of the event organizers and enjoy making a difference.
- 5. **Share Your Experience**: After the cleanup, share your experience on social media to raise awareness and encourage others to join future events.

Plastic pollution is a massive problem for our ocean, but even small actions can make a big difference. Every bottle, every straw, every piece of trash you clean up can lead to a cleaner, healthier ocean. Join us this season to clean up your local beach, stream, park or neighborhood. Outings Update

On the evening of Saturday, August 17th we had the pleasure of having Sea Turtle Oversight Protection lead us on a fun and educating Turtle Trek! We learned about these amazing marine mammals who come to nest on Broward County shores in the thousands every year, and the human threats that they face during this crucial time in their life cycle. We got to witness some hatchlings being released and faced toward the ocean, as they can become disoriented from the artificial light of our urbanized coastline.

As we look forward to cooling fall temperatures, so we look forward to a fall of fun Outings! We have several taking place in the coming weeks, and ones just on the horizon!

September will also see a large pickup in the Fall Bird Migration along the Atlantic Flyway, when huge numbers of migratory bird species make their way South to overwinter in other areas of the hemisphere! Broward County is a hotspot for these species, and Outings Chair **Jordan Holaday will be leading us every other Sunday in September** and October to a new location in Broward County to check them out! Each one will take place in a different part of the County, and present a new ecosystem to explore and discover these birds.

Saturday, October 5th we will be taking a half-day paddle along the famous Fisheating Creek in Palmdale! This gorgeous body of water is frequently cited as the most beautiful paddle in Florida, thanks to spending most of it's history undeveloped. The waters are navigable only for a small window of time, and we will be organizing a trip at the perfect time! Pre-registration is required, as space is limited! Commercial fishing corporation are trying to overturn this law by tricking Floridian's into thinking their right to fish and hunt is in jeopardy.





On Wednesday, October 9 from 1:00 – 2:00 PM

The Florida Chapter of the Sierra Club will hold a webinar with Alex Kate Halvey from the Department of Energy's Office of Policy.

Halvey will share how entities that don't pay taxes can recoup 30 percent of their clean energy investment—equal to the clean energy tax credits businesses receive. Through this provision, the money comes as a direct cash payment.

Every organization exempt from paying income taxes under §501-530—including §501(c) and §501(d) organizations—is eligible for this direct cash payment. This includes, but is not limited to, county and city governments, school districts, hospitals, colleges, charities, Native tribal agencies, and religious organizations. The credit covers numerous clean energy investments, from clean energy generation and storage, to clean commercial vehicles, certain EV chargers, and much more.

During the webinar, we will describe how easy it is for organizations and local governments to take advantage of this program to get back 30 percent of their clean energy investment. Unlike IRA/IIJA grants, there is no application or selection process; as any project meeting criteria for the specific credit is eligible to earn the tax credit after the project is complete. Even better, these credits can be combined with other sources of federal financial assistance.
