Good News for Dallas

Todate, the city has installed 892 kW of solar panels on its buildings or land. These installations pay for themselves after an average of 9 years of service, and will provide the city with free electricity for the remainder of their lives. Soon work will begin installing an additional 1088 kW on Martin Luther King Community Center buildings and its parking lot. (Imagine parking in the shade of solar panels!) This project will provide cheap electricity to neighborhood subscribers as well as the community center.
