The MA House of Representatives still has not passed the climate bill, despite the <u>Senate passing the bill in a reconvened formal session</u> last week. Instead, the Speaker of the House, Ron Mariano, has said he will defer calling the House back until an economic development bill emerges.

- The climate bill must not be tied to the fate of a yet-to-be-seen economic development bill.
- After the legislative failure this summer, we are now very close to the passage of an excellent climate bill. We must not see a second failure.

New Offshore Wind Bid Winners



Last week, the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management announced two offshore wind bid winners on four lease areas in the Gulf of

Maine! Today's sale marks significant progress toward developing responsible, equitable offshore wind in New England. Two lease areas went to Invenergy NE Offshore Wind, and two went to Avangrid Renewables.

- The wind in the Gulf of Maine is stronger than almost anywhere in the world.
- The areas auctioned last week have the potential to power 2.3 million homes.
