Adam Roberti serves as executive director of the Xavier Cortada Foundation, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to use socially engaged art to create meaningful experiences that inspire people to take collective action against our climate and ecological crises. Working closely with Cortada, a renowned Cuban American artist who belongs to the Florida Artists Hall of Fame, Roberti manages large-scale, interactive eco-art initiatives such as the Reclamation Project and The Underwater – two projects featured in Cortada's 2022 TED Talk. Through these public art interventions, he spearheads the foundation's collaborations with local schools, parks, libraries, businesses, and governments to engage and educate vulnerable communities, helping them prepare for the climate crisis and motivating them to get involved in local policymaking.

Roberti is a double alumnus of the University of Miami, where he currently serves on an interdisciplinary research team specializing in climate migration and retreat. In 2023, he was recognized by the university as a 30 Under 30 honoree, selected as an Aspen Institute Future Leader Climate Fellow, and invited to Washington, D.C. as a delegate at the Local Conference of Youth USA.


Urgent Voting Deadlines

- **Call your friends now** to make sure they are registered to vote and know their vote-by-mail status.
- **By next week** Absentee (vote-by-mail) ballots will start arriving.
- **October 7 is the deadline** in Florida to register to vote in the General Election on November 5.
- October 21 Early Voting Begins in Broward.
- October 24 at 5:00 pm is the deadline to request again that your ballot be mailed (Absentee or Vote-by-mail). If you last voted by mail before 2023, Florida's Governor and Legislature purged your absentee request.
- Broward Supervisor of Elections <u>BrowardVotes.gov</u> helps with voting issues, or go straight to "<u>Voter Info</u>" to check your registration, address, vote-by-mail status, polling place, download a sample ballot, make some changes such as request a vote-by-mail ballot, or find out where and when to drop off an Absentee ballot or call (954) 357-8683
- Vote-By-Mail ballots cannot be forwarded If you want your Vote-by-mail ballot sent to an address different from the one on file with the Elections Office, follow directions:

- **Vote on Tuesday November 5** at your polling place if you did not vote Early or Absentee (Vote-by-mail).



Florida Voters: Florida's Right to Clean Water is gathering petitions to get an amendment to the state constitution on the 2026 ballot. They need to collect 900,000 signatures. A summary of the proposed amendment is below, and you can find details on how to sign a petition here: https://www.floridarighttocleanwater.org/petition

"This amendment creates an enforceable, fundamental right to clean and healthy waters, authorizing a person to sue for equitable relief when a State executive agency, by action or inaction, allows harm or threat of harm to Florida waters. This amendment provides for strict judicial scrutiny of such action or inaction; adds to available remedies; identifies affected constitutional provisions; provides for enforcement; defines terms; and requires attorney's fees and costs to prevailing plaintiffs."



Florida Chapter Webinar Wednesday, October 9, 1:00 – 2:00 PM

The Florida Chapter of the Sierra Club will hold a webinar with Alex Kate Halvey from the Department of Energy's Office of Policy.

Halvey will share how entities that don't pay taxes can recoup 30 percent of their clean energy investment—equal to the clean energy tax credits businesses receive. Through this provision, the money comes as a direct cash payment.

Every organization exempt from paying income taxes under §501-530—including §501(c) and §501(d) organizations—is eligible for this direct cash payment. This includes, but is not limited to, county and city governments, school districts, hospitals, colleges, charities, Native tribal agencies, and religious organizations. The credit covers numerous clean energy investments, from clean energy generation and storage, to clean commercial vehicles, certain EV chargers, and much more.

During the webinar, we will describe how easy it is for organizations and local governments to take advantage of this program to get back 30 percent of their clean energy investment. Unlike IRA/IIJA grants, there is no application or selection process; as any project meeting criteria for the specific credit is eligible to earn the tax credit after the project is complete. Even better, these credits can be combined with other sources of federal financial assistance.
