



Legislative FAQ

How many bills pass each session?

- Most bills <u>do not</u> pass!
- In 2023:
 - 5413 House Bills Filed, 744 Sent to Governor (14%)
 - 2633 Senate Bills Filed, 502 Sent to Governor (19%
- Abbott vetoed 77 of those bills




Figure 2. Annual electricity savings as a percent of state energy MWh sales per state EERS policies. For the purpose of comparison, ACEEE estimated an average annual savings target by calculating each state's EERS





- Change that people see themselves benefiting from






