Gov. Healey Signs Climate Bill

Governor Healey has now officially signed the 2024 Massachusetts Climate Bill into law, An Act promoting a clean energy grid, advancing equity, and protecting ratepayers. Looking toward the new year, we will continue to work to ensure all provisions are implemented with the least impact on communities and our natural environment.

Methane Pipelines, Climate Change, & What Comes Next

Across New England and the U.S., the extraction, transportation, and burning of fossil fuels continues to increase even as it destroys our climate. Project Maple is Enbridge's proposed expansion of a methane pipeline in NY, CT, RI, and MA. If allowed to move forward, it would continue to tie our region to dirty fossil fuels, raise energy ratepayer rates, pollute the air of our communities, and prevent our states from meeting their climate goals.
