SIERRA LEADS VICTORY OVER PROPOSED WATER QUALITY ROLLBACKS

DEP and SFWMD Back Down - By George Cavros, Conservation Chair

Last month, the two state agencies entrusted with protecting our water supply, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), teamed up to force Broward County to degrade its surface water quality standards by allowing utilities to dump partially treated sewage into Broward canals. The dumping would have polluted our canals with phosphorous and nitrogen likely leading to algae blooms and fish kills. Those plans came to screeching halt when the Broward Sierra Group mobilized a coalition of conservation groups in opposition to

In order to accommodate growth, Broward County is under pressure by state agencies to reduce its dependence on Everglades water and not increase the burden on the Biscayne drinking water aquifer. The SFWMD predicts that Broward's population will rise from 1.8 million to 2.3 million by 2025. Broward only reuses 5% of its water, and striving for higher reuse will benefit the ecosystem. Reuse water can be used for irrigation of green spaces such as golf courses, lawns, and parks. Unfortunately, the state plan wanted to convert Broward County's 1,800 miles of canals into reuse cesspools.

Broward County has more protective surface water quality standards than state standards. Broward measures pollutants discharged from a point source, whereas; the state measures how much pollution a water body can absorb before becoming ecologically impaired. Broward maintains higher standards because our canals flow west into the Everglades - impacting the \$10 billion dollar restoration effort. Our canals flow east into the ocean affecting our beaches and coral reefs. Broward coral reefs are an economic engine that generate \$2 billion dollars per year in diving and fishing related

activity. Perhaps most importantly, our canals recharge the most prolific underwater drinking source in the United States, the Biscayne Aquifer.

Commissioner Kristin Jacobs was instrumental in leading the opposition against the proposed rule. She stated in a November 3rd Sun Sentinel article that "this is the cheap way out ... polluting the water we already have in order to have more water is the wrong way to go." The DEP and SFWMD met a flood of resistance at a meeting of the Technical Advisory Committee of the water resources board in November. The



The opposition seemed to catch state officials by surprise. DEP and SFWMD officials backed off on bringing the matter to a vote and the Broward Technical Advisory Committee voted to table the measure indefinitely.

The victory was nothing short of a stunning display of how a united local environmental community can quickly mobilize to hold the line on water quality in the face of intense state pressure. In the meantime, Broward County must begin the process of creating more water reuse in an environmentally sustainable way for its growing population. We can all be proud that the environmental community drew a line in the sand on maintaining Broward's higher water quality standards – and won.
