The ongoing Saga of the Florida Black Bear

March 17, 2016: Renowned scientists, including Drs. Stuart Pimm and Adrian Treves, and over a dozen conservation and animal-protection organizations, including the Center for Biological Diversity, Sierra Club and Animal Legal Defense Fund, today submitted a scientific petition to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to protect the Florida black bear under the federal Endangered Species Act. Habitat loss, roadkills and the first state-authorized bear hunt in over 20 years made 2015 a deadly year for Florida black bears, with humans responsible for killing at least 590 bears out of an estimated population of 3,000 to 3,500.

Over a year later on April 18, 2017: The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced a negative 90-day finding on our petition to list the Florida black bear under the Endangered Species Act https://s3.amazonaws.com/public-inspection. federalregister.gov/2017-07942.pdf. The notice does not include the reasons for the denial, but rather provides a link where that information is available.

The reasons for the denial are now posted at: https://www.regulations.gov/ docket?D=FWS-R4-ES-2017-0015 Oct 23, 2017: We finally received documents from the Service regarding its decision to deny ESA protections for the Florida black bear. We're still evaluating the documents and will let you know of our next steps.
