

1	Big Cypress Hike on the Florida Trail Saturday, January 18, 9:30 AM-4:00 PM Meet at the Oasis Visitor Center, 52105 Tamiami Trail E, Ochopee, for a three to four mile round trip hike to Robert Strand. 	Nature Walk at Wakodahatchee and hike at Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge: February 22, 2020 Palm Beach County offers us two opportunities, within 13 miles of each other, to learn the great diversity of wildlife that constructed wetlands and a bald cypress swamp support. We'll explore the 50 acre Wakodahatchee Wetlands by boardwalk in West Delray Beach. Then we will drive to the Loxahatchee Refuge in Boynton Beach where we will travel the Cypress Swamp Boardwalk, a 0.4-mile trail that loops through towering cypress trees, pond apple trees, ferns and other flora of the swamp, behind the Loxahatchee visitor's center. We will also take a short hike on a trail in the refuge. Each location provides accessible boardwalks, where we may see endangered Wood Storks, a Snail Kite, or any of 270 other species of birds in the refuge. We expect the trip to both parks and lunch to run from 9:30 a.m. until approximately 3:30 p.m. We ask that you bring your own lunch, which we'll break for, between traveling to our 2nd location.
