Speaker: Mr. Richard Grosso, Professor of Law, and Director of the Environmental and Land-use Law Clinic at Nova Southeastern University.

Professor Grosso is a lawyer and a professor of law at the Shepard Broad College of Law at Nova Southeastern University. He teaches in the areas of environmental, energy, land use, administrative, appellate practice and federal and state constitutional law. Professor Grosso is a widely recognized legal expert, practicing lawyer and policy advocate, with 34 years of experience litigating and advocating on statewide and south Florida environmental issues. His teaching and legal practice specializes in land use, growth management and environmental policy and permitting issues.

Professor Grosso will discuss the legal latitude enjoyed by local and state government to maintain, improve sustainable and standards requiring apply development. His talk will touch upon the laws concerning state agency rules and local government comprehensive plans and zoning codes, and the application of those standards to individual development applications. The extent and limitations of private property rights and how they impact government decisions will also be discussed. Professor Grosso will also offer advice on how to engage in environmental and community advocacy while minimizing the threat of lawsuits directed at the exercise of your First Amendment rights.
