Broward Sierra Club General Meeting

Time: October 7, 2021 at 07:00 PM EST We will have two presenters in October:

- Louis Aguirre will present from 7:00 8:00 PM: **Keeping our Community Pristine**.
- Joe Bonasia will present from 8:00 8:30 PM: Florida Rights of Nature, presenting FL5.org amendments. These are five amendments we must get on the ballot in 2022.

In September 2017, WPLG-Local 10 welcomed Emmy-award winning journalist Louis Aguirre back home to South Florida and the Local 10 family. Louis co-anchors the station's weekday 3:30 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. newscasts. He also reports for the 11 p.m. newscast. He's also Local 10's Environmental Advocate.

Beginning his television career at Telemundo in 1989, as a Spanish-language reporter, Louis eventually made the jump to Local 10 as a reporter and then weekend anchor.

Louis worked at Local 10 from 1989 to 1992, during which time he became one of the few American journalists allowed into Cuba to cover the 30th anniversary of the Cuban missile crisis.

Louis would later spend 14 years at WSVN in Miami before relocating to Los Angeles in 2014 to anchor the nationally syndicated program "The Insider."



Aguirre-A native of Miami, Louis is a graduate of the University of Miami and the *Universite de Paris* at La Sorbonne.


On his free time, Louis enjoys spending time at the beach with his two rescue dogs.

He's also involved in many local charities and advocates for the Humane Society & Best Friends Animal Society. A staunch defender of the planet, Aguirre is passionate about using his voice and his platform to create awareness about environmental issues.


A Sierra Club member for decades, Joseph Bonasia is Citizens' Climate Lobby's legislative liaison to Senator Rick Scott's office. He is also Vice-Chair and SWFL Regional Director of the Florida Rights of Nature Network. It is in this latter capacity that he will speak about the Right to Clean Water Constitutional Amendment and four other amendments that make up the FL5.org slate of amendments for the 2022 ballot. He will discuss:

- Orange County's historic Right to Clean Water Charter / Rights of Nature Amendment.
- The first rights of nature enforcement case in the nation, which the Orlando Business Journal says could have a major impact on development in Florida.
- The state preemption of rights of nature laws.
- The current petition drive to amend the Florida State Constitution to legally recognize every Floridian's right to clean water and to legally recognize rights for Florida's waterways.
- Four other environmental constitutional amendments.

Do you care about plastic pollution in Florida?

Your input is needed in an important survey.

Florida, surrounded on three sides by water, is a major conduit of plastics into our waterways and oceans. Single-use plastics litter our communities and have recently been found to impact human health. We need companies to dramatically reduce their production of this everlasting pollutant and provide us with plastic-free choices, and we need policy-makers to pass legislation that ensures they do so.

The University of Florida (UF) is conducting a survey on behalf of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to learn more about the use of plastic bags, auxiliary materials and wrappings (UF IRB Protocol Number IRB202101831) per 403.7033 Florida Statutes. They are administering five surveys to gather information from multiple stakeholder groups (local governments, residents, retailers, manufacturers and recycling facilities). We are asking Sierra members to complete the residential survey.

The survey will be administered online now until October 31st. The results will be provided to legislators for the upcoming 2022 session as they consider proposed single use plastics legislation.

Broward Sierra Club is planning a day outing to the Bonnet House for a walking tour and then a picnic and tram tour at Birch State Park across the street from the Bonnet House on Sunday, October 24th. Our day will begin at 9:30 AM at the Bonnet House at 900 North Birch Road, Ft. Lauderdale, and will end at 3:30 at Birch State Park. The Bonnet House museum and gardens is a historic home located at 900 Birch Road, in East Ft. Lauderdale. The Bonnet House history dates back to the early 1900's that includes beautiful art paintings and murals located throughout the house. The gardens premier one of the last barrier island habitats with 5 distinct ecosystems. The history of the Hugh Taylor Birch family and his daughter's life at the Bonnet House are one of South Florida's unique stories. Hugh Taylor Birch State Park is also a South Florida gem on a precious island that preserves just a sliver of the natural splendor that once was natural undeveloped Broward County. With access to the beach, a natural freshwater lagoon, and plenty of hardwood hammock trails, our day will be complete.
