Earth Day Celebration

It's going to be a great day at Anne Kolb Nature Center on March 6th when we invite our members and their friends and families to join us at our annual Earth Day celebration event on March 6th, 2022. from 10 AM to 5 PM. Our annual event includes seven notable speakers who will present about topics that include ocean health, coral reef restoration, sea turtle protection, the state of the arctic ice, urban farming and fresh food, and a special presentation by county Commissioner Beam Furr. There will be 14 table exhibitors representing environmental organizations, an art exhibit displaying art created by a local artist using plastic waste, a 70's band, food trucks, and full access to the park's facilities.

We are also featuring an art contest for high school students to design an original artwork piece using discarded plastic waste. We hope this contest will encourage young artists to use creativity of expression about this overwhelming issue of plastic pollution. The top 3 art pieces will be selected by judges during our Earth Day event and cash prizes will be awarded to the student winners.

Please join us to learn about local environmental organizations, and listen to topics about climate change, the natural environment, and organic farming practices. Please visit us to learn about organizations that support conservation, clean water and air quality for all of us, our beaches and our waterways.



A Second Nature Walk at Wakodahatchee and Green Cay Wetlands

When: Sunday, March 13, 2022

It's time again to explore the 50-acre Wakodahatchee Wetlands, in West Delray Beach and the 100-acre Green Cay Wetlands, in Boynton Beach. Both are 'Birder's Paradises'. I, Adriene, your Outings Leader, will lead a nature walk and educate our participants about both wetland preserves, and discuss the importance of wetlands and their relationship to clean water. These unique habitats support a variety of plants, birds and wildlife that have evolved and thrived. We visited both wetland preserves in January, and now we are going back to visit the huge wood stork colony, as well as the other variety of nesting birds as they have settled into their nests to have their babies!!! Bring your cameras and binoculars to experience a true bird safari! We will visit Wakodahatchee first, at 8:30 AM, and then head over to Green Cay Wetlands at 11:00 where we will have lunch in a shaded area in the parking lot, and discuss the importance of preservation and clean waterways. Then we will explore Green Cay and observe the nesting birds and other wildlife and plants that live in the preserve.

Each location provides accessible boardwalks (3/4 mile and 1.5 mile respectively), allowing for easy viewing of birds. We expect the trip to run from 8:30 AM till approximately 2:00 PM. We ask that you bring your own lunch (with a minimum of single-use plastic), which we'll break for at our 2nd location at Green Cay.

Rated: Easy. Participant limit is 20 people.


County



Did you know that we can all participate in Broward County Commission meetings? Meetings are held every other Tuesday at 10am. We may all attend either in person or remotely.

Take action: Learn about the meetings and how to attend. Visit Broward.org, click on the menu bar in the upper left-hand corner, click on "Government," and then click on "Government Meetings." Click around to familiarize yourself with the site so you're ready to attend a future meeting. You never know when a meeting agenda will contain an environmental issue.

State



The Goliath Grouper has been protected for decades so that its population could recover. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) is now considering lifting the harvesting ban although the population has not yet recovered.

Tell the commission to vote no on the proposed "harvest" of goliath groupers so this fragile species has a chance to survive.

Federal



A climate bill has been introduced in Congress: the Future Generations Protection Act bans fracking and stops new fossil fuel power plants and exports.

Take action: Call your Rep. to ask him/her to co-sponsor H.R. 6168, the Future Generations Protection Act.
