Sierra Club – John Muir Chapter Testifies on State Budget's Impacts on Transportation and Natural Resources at Milwaukee Budget Hearing

Milwaukee: Today Sierra Club Beyond Oil Subcommittee representative Bill Sell and other members of the <u>Coalition for More Responsible Transportation</u> (CMRT) testified before the Joint Finance Committee at the public hearing to discuss our organization's serious concerns about the state budget's impact on transportation and Wisconsin's natural resources.

The proposed transportation budget eliminates complete streets and state funds for the Transportation Alternatives program critical for bike paths and sidewalks that foster pedestrian safety and healthier, cleaner alternatives to driving. We are concerned about the \$1.3 billion in bonding being too high. One way to reduce debt would be to cut unnecessary highway projects like the I-94 east west corridor that is slated to cost taxpayers \$850 million. Projects like that don't make sense given that the local community opposes the project, people are driving less, and given that we could <u>fix this section of road</u> for \$371 million and expand transit to alleviate traffic.

Considering the transit and rehab option for the I-94 east west corridor would free up \$500 million needed for other crucial budget needs, from stewardship; to DNR science, forestry and education staff; to County Land and Water Conservation staff; to transit and local road maintenance; to recycling grants for local communities; to state funding for Safe Routes to School; to public education; to public media; and the University of Wisconsin.
