### After the Elections, Speak Up for Climate Action

Climate action was not a losing message in the elections. For US Senate, six strong leaders for climate action were elected: Gary Peters (Michigan), Jeanne Shaheen (New Hampshire), Jeff Merkley (Oregon), Brian Schatz (Hawaii), Tom Udall (New Mexico), and Al Franken (Minnesota).

In a Congressional race in Nebraska, Republican Representative Lee Terry – that state's leading advocate for the Keystone pipeline – was defeated. But with the new Republican majority in the US Senate, there is a belief that environmental laws must be weakened or repealed to make way for so-called economic growth. Despite Lee Terry's loss, one of the first targets on the GOP list is the Keystone pipeline. That makes our efforts to speak up for climate action more important than ever.

Make sure your elected officials understand we already have too much greenhouse gas pollution in our atmosphere. Let's draw a red line in the atmosphere and commit to stopping the buildup of greenhouse gases before 2030.

Reach out to community leaders, community groups, and the news media to educate them about the dangers of climate change as well as the climate solutions that work.

Invite your friends, family, neighbors, and colleagues to join the Sierra Club and other groups that are leading the way for climate action and environmental protection.

Personal action continues to be important because it shows that the solutions work. At home, at work, and in your community, you can conserve energy, prepare for extreme weather, divest from fossil fuels, and invest in clean energy.

Climate solutions – like energy efficiency, wind, and solar – create jobs, save consumers money, and protect health and the environment.

With sustained education about the importance of the environment and climate action, we can elect candidates and adopt laws that will improve health, broaden prosperity, and safeguard our people and property from the effects of climate change.

Winter Outing, Friday-Sunday, February 6-8:

Our Sierra Winter Outing will be at Backbone cabins again, this year from February 6-8. The basics of that weekend: Our Winter Outing is in Cabin #9 at Backbone State Park, near Strawberry Point, an hour from Cedar Rapids. Two-story cabins, heated, include a stove/oven, refrigerator, microwave, pots/pans, a shower and beds. There are "beds" for a total of 9 people each night, and a few more can sleep on their own cots/pads, for a maximum of 12 people each night. Early registrants are given sleeping priority, so reserve your bed ASAP. Lodging is \$20/night or (\$30 for both nights) per person. Sleeping bag/bedding and towels are not provided.

Cabin #9 at Backbone has a great view of the lake, and we plan on snowshoeing, x-country skiing, hiking, etc., depending on the weather. Bring appropriate equipment. We can get in any time after 4p on Friday, and we need to be out by 1pm on Sunday.

We are on our own for food Friday night and Saturday lunch (with lots of sharing). We provide Saturday breakfast, and Sunday breakfast. We also provide our entree for Saturaday night.
