Advocating for the Clean Power Plan in D.C.

Early September included a
Climate Fly-In with our partners
from National Wildlife Federation,
Union of Concerned Scientists,
League of Conservation Voters,
Mom's Clean Air Force, and
Environment America. The
Climate Fly-In provided for eight
advocates to go to Washington,
DC and appeal to our
congressional delegates to
support the Clean Power Plan, the
Environmental Protection
Agency's plan to reduce carbon
from power plants nationwide.

and is also a Derry Energy Committee member; Peter Egelston, President of Smuttynose Brewery; Mary Westfall, the Senior Minister of the Community Church of Durham United Church of Christ; Meghan Hoye of LighTech, Inc in Merrimack; Tim Moore of Tim Moore Outdoors Fishing and Hunting Guide; Rob Werner of League of Conservation Voters; and NH Sierra Club Chapter Director Catherine Corkery.

We delivered the message that we have to address climate by supporting the Clean Power Plan in Washington as a diverse group concerned about public health, the future for our children, business growth, job creation, and the moral obligation. Senior Senator Jeanne Shaheen and Peter Egelston participated in a morning roundtable alongside senators Sheldon Whitehouse (RI), Ed Markey (MA) and Angus King (ME). Senator Shaheen later met with the entire group. The group also met with Congresswoman Ann McLane Kuster (NH 2nd district) and Senator Ayotte briefly, and then later with her staff. We reassured them that the Plan accommodates the existing carbon reduction programs in New Hampshire and that there is bipartisan support in the Granite State. We were unable to secure a meeting with the office of Representative Frank Guinta (NH 1st district).

The diverse group demonstrated the bipartisan support for the Clean Power Plan and the need to address climate changing emissions now. Katie Robert provided statistics about Granite Staters affected by asthma and other chronic illnesses that will worsen if the Clean Power Plan does not move forward. Fisherman Tim Moore spoke about the virtual disappearance of smelt in the Great Bay and ice, for that matter, for ice fishing. Meghan Hoye talked about the demand to upgrade buildings and the workforce needed to meet the demand. Peter Egelston simply explained that his company saves money by prioritizing their values. Maureen Mann shared her daughter's concern to help her asthma suffering classmates. And Minister Westfall spoke wisely of the importance and the strategy of the Clean Power Plan to address all of these overlapping issues.

NHSC is so grateful to have hosted these leaders from New Hampshire to speak our truth to the decision makers in Washington, DC. The Chapter is working hard to amplify our voices in Washington and throughout the state to move forward on climate solutions.

NH Needs Your Voice Tonight: Public Hearing on proposed new gas pipeline through NH

Tuesday, September 29 - 6pm at Franklin Pierce University in Rindge

This is an official, formal Public Scoping Hearing on the Northeast Energy Direct with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) at Franklin Pierce University in Rindge.

This is your chance to voice your concerns about this new pipeline proposed to carry fracked fossil fuel gas specifically from Pennsylvania to the East Coast for export and some local use. This will be a new pipeline -- the proposal is to create a new right-of-way path that does not currently exist, encompassing more than 15 communities from Winchester, NH to Brookline north, to Milford, Amherst, Merrimack, Litchfield, Londonderry, Windham and Salem.

Please attend to learn more and/or to speak about your concerns - for the record. **It is very important for FERC to hear your concerns**, so they will be addressed in their future analysis of the proposed project.
